She informed the students and the residents that their mindset is the most important strength they have. She encouraged them to focus and change their mindset. She further stated that it was important for women to be in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) fields because opportunities in STEM are evolving.

Over 450 people were treated.
